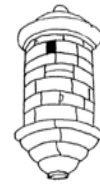


# The Citadel

## Councillors Letter

Local councillors Diana Hatcher, Linda Chambers and Adam Williams are continuing to follow up a number of outstanding issues on and around Victoria Dock, which have been raised since the last residents meeting. They've been chasing Highways England repeatedly about the need to repaint the "Keep Clear" markings on the Garrison Road roundabout. Highways England have assured them that they will be painted in the near future. They've also spoken to the Head of Regeneration at the Council, the Humber LEP and Highways England about the Garrison Road safety scheme, following the announcement that Castle Street has been delayed again. The Garrison Road scheme is still on track. The councillors have also raised a number of issues about overgrown hedges and bushes around the Dock with the Council's Streetscene team - including on the promenade near Harbour Way and Pilots Way - and also on South Bridge Road near the school. ## CRUISING

I am struggling enormously with the whole concept. I fear cruising itself may well be at a tipping point with the introduction of the Mega Cruise liners, which Hull is not likely to see.

While seeing the potential benefits to Hull and I still stress potential only, the location selection is poor on so many fronts, but the major concern being the residential status of Victoria Dock itself. When the original residents wanted to encourage the use of the development as a water themed recreation and residential area, this was poo poo'd by the council, despite it being the original concept. This mainly being due to cost of rehabilitation of the required marine infrastructure and the maintenance of this in terms of dredging etc. In austere times I can not really identify what

circumstance has changed that now warrants this as being acceptable.

The location and infrastructure is a potential bottle neck and Victoria Dock already suffers from peak traffic congestion due to none residents using the dock as a diversion to try and avoid the Hedon Road / Mount Pleasant congestion.

This has the distinct smell of a pet project with some degree of self-interest involved.

The Siemens plant at the eastern extremity, with now a working cruise terminal at the western extremity, residential seems to be taking very much a back step over commercial drivers. Siemens brings great benefit, the cruise terminal I fear may be an elephant of a paler shade than grey.

A cruise liner arriving at 06:00 and departing at 18:00 is going to create a great deal of disruption in

terms of Environmental impact, mechanical noise, infrastructure overloading and congestion. Cruise liner passengers are going to be highly delighted to sit in traffic for 40 minutes just getting off the dock.

The Victoria Dock School, Primary and Junior could well be impacted by significant traffic increases along with the potential for a much higher risk under even the most basis form of risk analysis for pedestrian and traffic issues or RTA's.

We have docks for the purpose of receiving shipping of all types, we have a residential development for the purposes of providing a quality of living for the people of Hull, now we want to amalgamate the two, You already know who the looser will be in that equation
