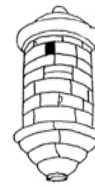

ABP - Joint Venture

ABP is less than a month away from handing over half of the final site to Siemens on Alexandra Dock. In the last three weeks there has been a significant change in the site, the marine works are almost complete, the site has been levelled and the capping layers of gravel have been delivered by sea and distributed across the site. The berth also received a trial berthing of an installation vessel across the Bank Holiday weekend, thus for the first time enabling Residents and Visitors alike an opportunity to appreciate the scale of the operation that will be undertaken.

The bird roosting platform has also been installed, one of the environmental requirements in the licence. It is certainly a feature and the hope is that it will be well used as an alternative to the roosting sites that have been lost to the development.

After consultation with Hull City Council, the planned meeting on the noise barrier has been delayed until October to coincide with the commencement of operations, and the associated Operational Noise Management Plan. Residents from affected properties will be invited accordingly over the next few weeks.

This is the culmination of 100 weeks of effort, and with only 19 weeks to go until completion of the project, Hull is about to embark upon an exciting new chapter.

HMS Illustrious

"We have done all we can for over two years to find a home for the former HMS Illustrious in the UK, and regrettably all options have now been exhausted," UK Minister for Defence Procurement Harriett Baldwin said in a statement.

Hull has lost out in its bid to turn aircraft carrier HMS Illustrious into a tourist attraction on the city's waterfront. Hull City Council confirmed it had missed out on the Ministry of Defence shortlist for the decommissioned ship. The vessel would have been docked next to aquarium The Deep, for Hull's City of Culture celebrations in 2017. Labour leader of the council Stephen Brady said he was "disappointed" at the decision.

'Economically unviable'

"We've had a significant amount of public support throughout," he said. "And although we gave it our best shot, it was made clear during the bidding process that the MoD intended to strip the vessel of its historic assets, and were unwilling to provide any long-term funding which, in fact, made it economically unviable as a heritage attraction.

Mr Brady said the city intended to continue with its plans to develop a cruise ship terminal. Lib Dem councillor Claire Thomas criticised the Labour authority for spending money on the bid. She said: "There are some really serious questions to ask now about why the council decided that it was a good thing to do to spend over £500,000 on trying to get HMS Illustrious to Hull when actually now it turns out it's not coming."

In a statement, the council said it had set aside £540,000 to develop a riverside berth that could be used for cruise ships and other vessels as well as a home for HMS Illustrious.

Comment

We are not aware of any consultation which has given Councillor Brady his belief that they have significant support, on the contrary many people appear to have the opposite view. Some people on Victoria Dock are opposed to this development whilst others like it.

This has cost us in excess of £1,000,000 to find out so far.
